ORDER

"Quami Ekta Week" (National Integration Week) is observed every year from 19<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> November throughout the Country. Communal Harmony Campaign coincides with Quami Ekta Week. The objectives of the programme is to foster the spirit of patriotism, National Integration and Communal Harmony. The celebrations of the week include convening Public Meetings, Prabhat Bheries, taking the Pledge of National Integration of the people, holding debates, discussions, etc. It has been decided to celebrate the "Quami Ekta Week" this year also from 19<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 in a befitting manner. Programmes may be drawn up generally in accordance with the following guidelines:-

i) Tuesday, the 19<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 – National Integration Day.

Meetings, Symposia and seminars to emphasize the themes of secularism, anti communalism and non-violence may be arranged /organized in all District of the State by the District Administration. The Director of Information and Public Relations will chalk out the programmes to be arranged/organized on this day and intimate the District Administration well in advance for proper implementation.

ii) Wednesday, the 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 - Welfare of Minorities Day.

Items of the 15 Point programme to be emphasized. In riot prone towns, special fraternal processions should be taken out.

iii) Thursday, the 21<sup>st</sup> November, 2019 – Linguistic Harmony Day.

Special literary functions and Kavi Sammelans may be organised to enable people of each region to appreciate the linguistic heritage of other parts of India.

iv) Friday, the 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2019 – Weaker Sections Day.

Meetings and rallies may be organized to highlight items under various Government programmes which help SCs/STs and weaker sections with particular emphasis on the distribution of surplus land to landless labourers.

v) **Saturday, the 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2019 – Cultural Unity Day.**

Cultural functions may be organized to present the Indian tradition of unity in diversity and for promoting cultural conservation and integration.

vi) **Sunday, the 24<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 – Women's Day.**

The importance of women in Indian Society and their role in development of nation-building may be highlighted.

vii) **Monday, the 25<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 – Conservation Day**

Meetings and functions may be organized to emphasis the growing need for awareness and action to conserve the environment.

2. **The National Integration Pledge should be taken on Tuesday, the 19<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 at 11.A.M. by assembling in the premises of the Office/Institution.** The active participation of all Staff members in the pledge taking ceremony may be ensured. The Head of Office may administer the pledge. Text of the National Integration pledge both in English and Malayalam is attached.

3. All District Collectors/Heads of Department particularly the Director of Public Instruction, Director of Collegiate Education, the Director of Technical Education, the Director of Vocational Higher Secondary Education, the Director of Medical Education, the Registrar of Universities and the Chief Executive of all Public Sector Undertakings are requested to draw up suitable detailed programme so as to make it a sustained programme throughout the week and also to issue specific instructions to the Heads of Institutions under their control to carry out the different programmes in a befitting manner.

4. All District Collectors, the Secretary to Government, Cultural Affairs Department, the Director of Scheduled Caste Development, the Director of Tribal Welfare, the Director of Social Justice, the Secretary, Kerala Sahitya Academy, the Secretary, Sangeetha Nadaka Academy and Chief Conservator of Forests are requested to see that suitable programmes emphasizing the themes on Secularism, Non-violence, Communal Harmony, Minority Welfare, Linguistic Harmony, Welfare of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and weaker sections, Women's welfare, Cultural unity etc. are formulated and carried out throughout the state and to make all efforts to make this year's programme a grand success with the widest possible participation.

5. The Director, Information and Public Relations will enlist the co-operation of All India Radio, Doordarshan and Editors of all News papers in this regard and arrange for wide publicity to the programmes outlined for all the days in the "Quami Ekta Week".


“ I solemnly pledge to work with dedication to preserve and strengthen the freedom and integrity of the nation.
